What is Pazopanib Tablet?

Pazopanib Tablet is a drug that is used to treat advanced renal cell carcinoma (RCC) in adults. RCC is a kind of cancer that starts in the cells of the kidneys. Pazopanib belongs to the kinase inhibitor class of drugs. It helps to slow down or prevent cancer cells from spreading.

Pazopanib Tablet - How To Use

- Pazopanib is available as a tablet that must be swallowed. It's normally taken once a day on an empty stomach, at least 60 minutes before or after a meal. Pazopanib should be taken at the same time each day. Follow the advice on your prescription label properly.
- Do not break, chew, or crush the tablets; they must be swallowed whole.
- During your treatment, your doctor may alter your pazopanib dose or stop it altogether.
 This is dependent on how effective the medication is for you. Discuss your feelings with your doctor during your treatment.

Even if you feel fine, keep taking the pazopanib tablet. Stopping pazopanib without consulting your doctor is not a good decision.

How It Works

Pazopanib tablet is a cancer-fighting drug. It acts by attaching to and blocking the enzyme receptors (tyrosine kinase) that are involved in cancer cell proliferation. It also prevents the tumour from forming new blood vessels. This is how cancer is countered.

Precautions for Pazopanib Tablet

Before taking pazopanib,

- If you have an allergy to pazopanib, any other drugs, or any of the components in pazopanib tablet, notify your doctor.
- Tell your doctor about any additional drugs, vitamins, nutritional supplements, or herbal products you're taking or planning to use. Make a point of mentioning one or more of the following: procainamide, propafenone, propranolol, quinidine, sotalol, and verapamil;

- ; pimozide; rifampin; and thioridazine; certain medications for irregular heart Your specialist may need to adjust your prescription dosages or keep a close eye on you for side effects.
- If you've coughed up blood or experienced bleeding in your stomach, intestines, or head in the last 6 months, or if you've had surgery in the recent 7 days, notify your doctor. Tell your doctor if you have high blood pressure; a stroke; a heart problem; a heart attack; chest pain; or heart or thyroid disease.
- If you are pregnant, planning to become pregnant, or breastfeeding, notify your doctor. While taking a pazopanib tablet, you should avoid getting pregnant. Pazopanib has the potential to harm the foetus.
- Tell your doctor or dentist that you are taking pazopanib if you are having surgery, including dental surgery.

Pazopanib Tablet - Side Effects

- Diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, headaches, loss of appetite, weight loss, changed perception of taste, numbness/redness in hands/feet, and tiredness/weakness is all possible side effects. Tell your doctor right once if these side effects persist or worsen.
- It's possible that you'll experience temporary hair loss and/or a change in hair or skin colour. After the procedure, normal hair growth should resume.
- You were provided with this prescription because your doctor determined that the advantage to you exceeds the danger of side effects. Your risk can be reduced if your doctor keeps a close eye on you.
- If you have any serious side effects, such as signs of heart failure (swelling ankles/feet, weariness), or evidence of an underactive thyroid, contact your doctor straight away.
- Due to the quick death of cancer cells, pazopanib tablet might produce side effects. Your doctor may prescribe medicine and advise you to drink plenty of water to reduce your risk.
- This drug has the potential to increase your blood pressure. Regularly check your blood pressure and notify your doctor if the readings are too high. Your doctor may prescribe medication to help you manage your blood pressure.
- This medicine rarely causes a severe allergic reaction. However, if you detect any indications of significant allergic response, such as a rash, swelling, or problems breathing, seek medical attention right away.

FAQ for Pazopanib Tablet

Is Pazopanib a chemotherapy drug?

- Pazopanib Tablet is not a standard chemotherapy drug. It's a protein kinase inhibitor, which is a type of drug. Pazopanib acts by inhibiting the function of proteins involved in cancer cell proliferation and dissemination.
- What is the best way to take Pazopanib Tablet?

- Pazopanib tablet should be given once a day or as instructed by your doctor or pharmacist. Do not break or crush the tablets; instead, swallow them whole with water. This has an impact on how the medicine is taken and may raise the risk of side effects.
- Is it possible to take the Pazopanib tablet with food

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- Pazopanib tablet should be taken with or without food, at least 60 minutes before or after eating. It's possible that the dosage will need to be raised if it's taken with food. As a result, there will be greater adverse effects.
- Is there anything I can't eat while I'm on Pazopanib Tablet?
- Yes, grapefruit and grapefruit juice should be avoided when using the Pazopanib tablet because they may interfere with how the medicine functions in your body. Ask your doctor if there are any other foods you should prevent.
- What is the duration of my Pazopanib treatment?
- Pazopanib must be taken for a specific amount of time, which varies from person to person. The doctor will keep a close eye on you and be able to more effectively anticipate how long you will need to take the prescription. Do not stop accepting it without first consulting your physician. It should be used for as long as it is effective and you are able to tolerate it.
