What is Eberconazole Cream?

Eberconazole Cream belongs to the topical antifungals class of dermatological medications used in the treatment of fungal or yeast infections of the skin such as athlete's foot (affects toes), jock itch (affects groin area), candidiasis (which affects mouth, throat, gut, and vagina), and ringworm (affects skin or scalp). Athletes' foot, jock itch, and ringworm are all fungal illnesses, whereas *Candida albicans* causes candidiasis, which is a yeast infection. People with a weakened immune system are more likely to contract these infections. They can be passed from person to person by skin-to-skin contact. Eberconazole kills fungus by causing holes in their cell membranes. As a result, the fungal infection is cleared, and the cracking, burning, scaling, and itching of the skin produced by infections are relieved. It is for external use only.

How to Use It

- Eberconazole is available as a topical cream for use on the skin. Cleanse and dry the afflicted region with a cream.

- Gently apply medication of thin layer to the area affected. Hands should be washed before & after use.
- Follow your doctor's instructions for taking the medication. Do not use to open wounds or broken skin.
- This drug should not be used in the eyes. If the medication goes into your eyes by accident, rinse them well with water.

Precautions - Eberconazole Cream

- Please inform your doctor if you have an allergy to Eberconazole or any other medications. It should not be taken in higher dosages or for longer periods of time than indicated because it can produce side effects.
- In the elderly and children, use Eberconazole Cream with caution. Avoid smoking or coming near bare flames since it causes the fabric (bedding, clothing, and dressings) in touch with it to catch fire and burn readily, posing a major fire hazard.
- Before using this cream, tell your doctor if you are suffering from psoriasis, systemic lupus erythematosus (an autoimmune illness), or kidney or liver problems.
- It should not be used on open wounds, damaged, or broken skin. Unless recommended by a doctor, do not bandage or cover the treatment area with airtight dressings.
- This medication should not be swallowed, and if it is accidentally swallowed, get medical attention immediately.
- It quickly catches fire and burns, therefore avoid smoking or getting near naked flames. Scratching or pricking diseased regions of skin is not recommended since it can spread the infection or make it worse.

Benefits of Eberconazole

- Eberconazole Cream is made of Eberconazole is a broad-spectrum antifungal used to

treat dermatophytosis (a red, itchy, scaly, round rash), candidiasis (can affect the mouth, throat, stomach, and vagina), and pityriasis (affects the mouth, throat, gut, and vagina).

- The infection will heal in a few weeks, and the skin will return to its original colour in a few months.
- Apply enough to cover the affected region as well as 1 inch of the skin immediately surrounding it.
- It's best not to get it in your eyes, nose, or mouth. If you are accidentally exposed, quickly rinse with enough water.
- If the infection persists after 4 weeks of treatment, contact your doctor.

- Consume a nutritious diet rich in probiotics and low in sugar.
- Do not use the same socks every day and clean your feet on a regular basis.
- Wear clean cotton socks and use a separate clean towel for your feet.
- Do not share personal items with others, such as clothes, towels, or razors.
- Scratching the infected area of the skin can transfer the ailment to other parts of the body.
- To avoid fungal infections, avoid walking barefoot in moist areas like locker rooms and gym showers.
