What is Mupirocin Ointment?

Mupirocin Ointment is a type of antibiotic that is used in the treatment of impetigo (red sores), persistent boils, and other skin diseases. It works by eradicating specific germs. This aids in the improvement of your symptoms as well as the cure of the underlying infection. This medication is solely intended for external usage. It should only be applied to the affected area of the skin, according to your doctor's dose and schedule. Apply it on a regular basis, ideally at the same time every day, to obtain the most benefit.

How to use Mupirocin

- Mupirocin is administered to the skin as an ointment or a lotion. It is typically used 3 times a day for one to two weeks.
- After properly cleaning the affected region, apply a tiny amount (a thin film) of the ointment. A sterile gauze bandage can be used to cover the wound.
- Avoid getting mupirocin ointment in your eyes.

Precautions for Mupirocin Ointment

- If you have allergies to mupirocin or any other medications, inform your doctor.
- Tell your doctor about all of your prescription and OTC medications, notably [chloramphenicol](#).
- If you have a pregnancy, planning to become pregnant, or are breastfeeding, notifies your doctor.

It works to treat skin diseases like boils, impetigo, and affected hair follicles. It can also be used in the treatment of infections in minor skin cuts or wounds. This treatment has minimal typical adverse effects and should solve infections in a few days, but you should continue to use it for the full duration of the prescription.

How it Works

Mupirocin is a type of antibiotic that can be used to treat a variety of infections. It kills germs that can produce skin infections by blocking the production of essential proteins that bacteria need to survive. As a result, the skin infection does not spread.

Side Effects for Mupirocin Ointment

The majorities of side effects are minor and will go away as your body adapts to the medication. If they don't go away or you're concerned about them, see your doctor.

- Slight burning or stinging may occur after using this drug, though this is unusual. Prevent using this medicine and tell your doctor immediately if you have extreme burning, stinging, or irritation.
- Due to a bug called *C. difficile*, this medicine may induce severe intestinal disease in

certain people. This condition can develop during medication or weeks or months after it has ended. If you have persistent diarrhoea, abdominal or stomach pain, or blood/mucus in your stool, call your doctor immediately.

- If you have such symptoms, avoid taking anti-diarrhoea or opioid medications because they may worsen them.
- The use of this drug for an extended period of time or on a regular basis may result in a new fungus or yeast infection on the skin. If you detect an indication of a new infection, or if your present infection does not improve or worsen, call your doctor immediately.

Some Tips for Using Mupirocin

- Mupirocin is a bacterial skin infection treatment that is used to treat impetigo.
- Thoroughly clean the afflicted region before applying the medication three times a day. If necessary, a dressing can be given to the treated region.
- It's best not to get it in your eyes, mouth, or nose. If you get it in these places by accident, rinse with cold water.
- It has the potential to produce minor discomfort at the site of application. If the irritation persists, contact your doctor.
- Use for no more than ten days. Any leftover cream should be thrown away.
- Consult your doctor if your skin disease does not improve in 3 to 5 days.
